



### **Closure of Class Bubbles**

We are living in very uncertain times at the moment. Unfortunately, this week we received our first positive case at school. This is obviously a distressing and worrying time for all concerned, in particular for the individual who received the positive test. I cannot identify the name of any person who receives a positive test whether it be staff or pupil due to data protection rules. A reminder that everyone needs to be vigilant for the symptoms of Covid-19 which are:

- A new continuous cough
- High temperature
- Loss of taste or smell

If anyone in your household has any of these symptoms, please call 119 to book a test. Following Public Health Wales rules, we have to close class bubbles if there has been direct contact (i.e. a distance within 2 metres for 15 minutes, or 1 metre for 1 minute) with a positive case within 48 hours. This rule applies to staff and pupils.
