WOW Project - The Walk to School Challenge

Our school has been chosen to be part of an exciting behaviour change initiative to encourage more children and their families to walk to school. WOW, the Walk to School Challenge is delivered by Living Streets, the UK Charity for everyday walking, to help as many children as possible experience the benefits of walking to school. Thanks to funding from the Welsh Government, our school is one of 172 across Wales to take part in this project.

The pupil led challenge enables children to self-report how they get to school every day. If they challenge actively (walk/wheel, cycle, scoot or park and stride) at least one a week for a month, they get rewarded with a badge.

What are the benefits of walking to school?

- Children feel happier and healthier
- Arrive to school refreshed and ready to learn
- Helps reduce congestion and pollution at the school gates

What if we can't walk to school?

Park and stride to help your child earn their WOW badge. You can park at the MUGA or a 10 minutes walking distance from the school.
