## School Development Plan and School Priorities

The school write an annual school development plan, which identifies targets and focuses on what the learners do well and what we need to do to improve. The targets are regularly discussed by staff and the Governing Body and areas monitored by the LA in termly meetings. The school priorities for 2022/2023

Priority 1 - To improve the standard and enjoyment of reading and phonics across the school.

Priority 2 - To continue to embed the New Curriculum for Wales and developing knowledge and sharing

good practice whilst continuing to provide an inclusive education for all learners Priority 3 - To continue to develop assessment and pedagogy to improve learning effectiveness

Priority 4 - To further develop the use of Welsh language across the school

### Curriculum for Wales

From September 2022, the new curriculum became statutory and Welsh Government state that this will have more emphasis on equipping young people for life. It is designed to build their ability to learn new skills and apply their subject knowledge more positively and creatively. As the world changes, they will be more able to adapt positively. Meanwhile teachers will have more freedom to teach in ways they feel will have the best outcomes for their learners. Schools are also be responsible for designing their own Assessment Procedures.

The purpose of the new curriculum is to support our children and young people to be:

- ambitious, capable learners, ready to learn throughout their lives
- enterprising, creative contributors, ready to play a full part in life and work
- ethical, informed citizens of Wales and the world
- healthy, confident individuals, ready to lead fulfilling lives as valued members of society.

It will have six 'Areas of Learning and Experience' (AoLE).

- Expressive arts.
- Health and wellbeing.
- Humanities (including RE, which is compulsory to age 16).
- Languages, literacy and communication (including Welsh, is compulsory to age 16, and modern foreign languages).
- Mathematics and numeracy.
- Science and technology.

To embed the Curriculum for Wales we continued to hold Super Learning Weeks to create different ways of learning. In October 2022 all classes worked on a fiction story called 'It's a No-Money Day' by Kate Milner. The book explored the theme of a family who had nothing




in with our annual Harvest Festival; as part of our Harvest Festival we ask for donations of tins and packets which were donated to local foodbanks. All classes learned what a foodbank was and how children have the right to good quality healthcare, clean water, nutritious food

and a clean environment to stay healthy.



In February 2023 we held a Super Learning Week working on a 🐷 cross-curricular topic on the theme 'Our Local Area'. Classes used maps and photographs, all classes made local area visits to study. Nursery/Reception studied Plas Kynaston Lane; Year 1/2 studied Ty Mawr Country Park; Year 3/4 studied Castell Dinas Bran and Year 5/6 studied the Pontcysyllte Aqueduct. The areas studied also fed into our School Eisteddfod with classes making models based on their areas of study.







Pupils have been given the opportunity and encouraged to take part in a variety of activities again this year to strengthen their health and wellbeing.

**Swimming** - In the autumn term Year 6 pupils received weekly swimming sessions at Chirk Leisure Centre. In the second half of the autumn term and spring term Year 5 pupils received weekly swimming sessions, and Year 4 in the summer term.

Playmakers - 10 x Year 5 pupils took part in Active Wrexham Playmaker session to give the pupils confidence and ideas to create games for all year groups and encourage children to take part on their play

Y5/6 Running Club - In October Y5/6 had the opportunity to take part in an after school running club. Pupils were then chosen to represent the school in a Cross Country event with other Wrexham School at Ysgol Rhiwabon.

Urdd Football Sessions - Mr Urdd visited school in November and held football session with pupils in Y3 and Year 4 as part of Wales' Journey to the Football World Cup Competition.

Year 5/6 Girls Football Team - The Girls Football Team took part in an Active Wrexham competition with 24 other Wrexham primary schools at The Rock in November. The team played 5 games, winning 1, drawing 2 and loosing 2 and came 4th in their group. The team showed excellent behaviour and attitude throughout the day.

Year 5/6 Boys Football Team - Our Boys Football Team took part in an Active Wrexham Primary Schools Competitive World Cup Football event with 32 other Wrexham primary school at The Rock in November. They came top of their group and played in the finals in March, where they finished 5th overall out of 16 teams. The team were lucky and met some of the Wrexham first team players and had a photograph with Rob Lainton (first team goalkeeper)

Christmas Activity PE Day - We asked Progressive Sports to provide Christmas fun PE session for all classes in December. Activities included decorating members of staff as a Christmas tree and glow in the dark snowball fight.

Indoor Athletics Club - Year 5/6 pupils had the opportunity to take part in an indoor athletics club after school in January. Pupils were chosen to represent the school at an event with other Wrexham schools at Plas Madoc Leisure Centre. Pupils who participated in the competition received certificates.

Welsh Folk Dance - All classes learned and practised a Welsh Folk Dance for our St David's Day Celebrations.

Glan Llyn Residential Visit - Pupils in Year 5 and 6 had the opportunity to visit Glan Llyn for 3 full days of activities including raft building and floating, canoeing, orienteering, zip wire, etc.

**Y5/6 Lunchtime Rugby** - Pupils in Years 5 and 6 had the opportunity to take part in lunchtime rugby sessions in April. Pupil's were chosen to represent the school at a Rhos Rugby Club Tag Tournament, where they lost the first game but won the remaining 4.

Y6 Football Team - Our Year 6 Football Team took part in A Cefn Community Council tournament at Plas Madoc Leisure Centre in April. The team won their qualifying matches and won in the final. The team were presented with the Ken Bathers Memorial Trophy and Tyler Evans was presented with the Darren Bettis Memorial Trophy for the most goals scored in the tournament.

Y3/4 Participation Skills - Pupils in Years 3 and 4 were chosen to represent the school at an Active Wrexham Participation Skills event at Queensway in April.

Tennis Wales Festival - Year 3 and Year 5 took part in Tennis Wales Primary School Festival at Wrexham Tennis Centre in June.

Year 6 Fun Activity Afternoon - Year 6 pupils received a fun sporting afternoon with Progressive Sports, involving lots of sporting activities including inflatables.

# Fundraisers and Community Projects

MacMillan - In September we held a raffle to win an afternoon tea/coffee hamper. £133.06 raised.

Remembrance - In November 2022 the Head Boy and Head Girl read out the names of some of the fallen, and the Deputy Head Boy and Deputy Head Girl laid a wreath on behalf of the school at the Cefn Community Council Remembrance Service at the Cefn Mawr Cenotaph. Classes also visited the cenotaph to lay wreaths and remember the fallen.
